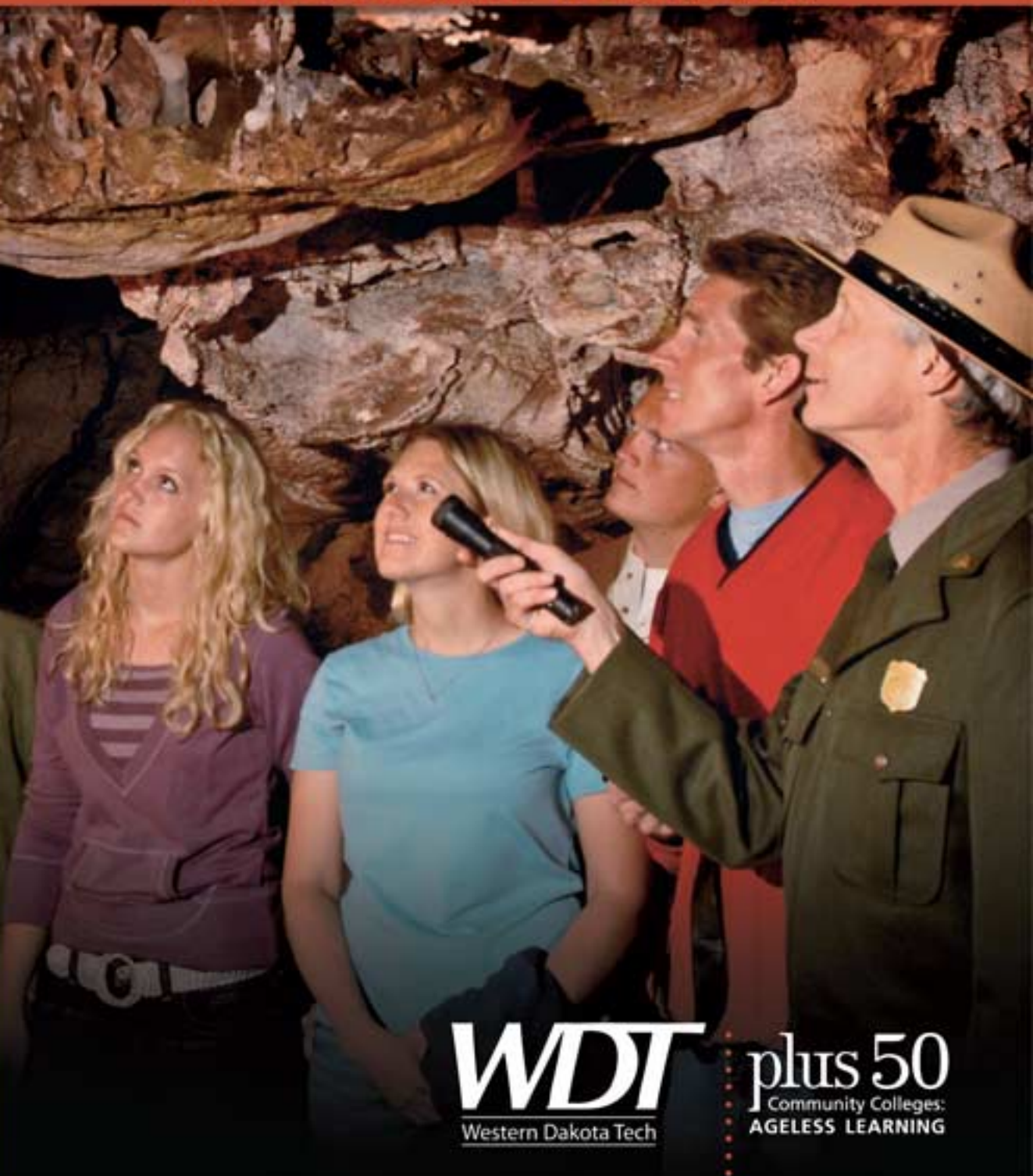

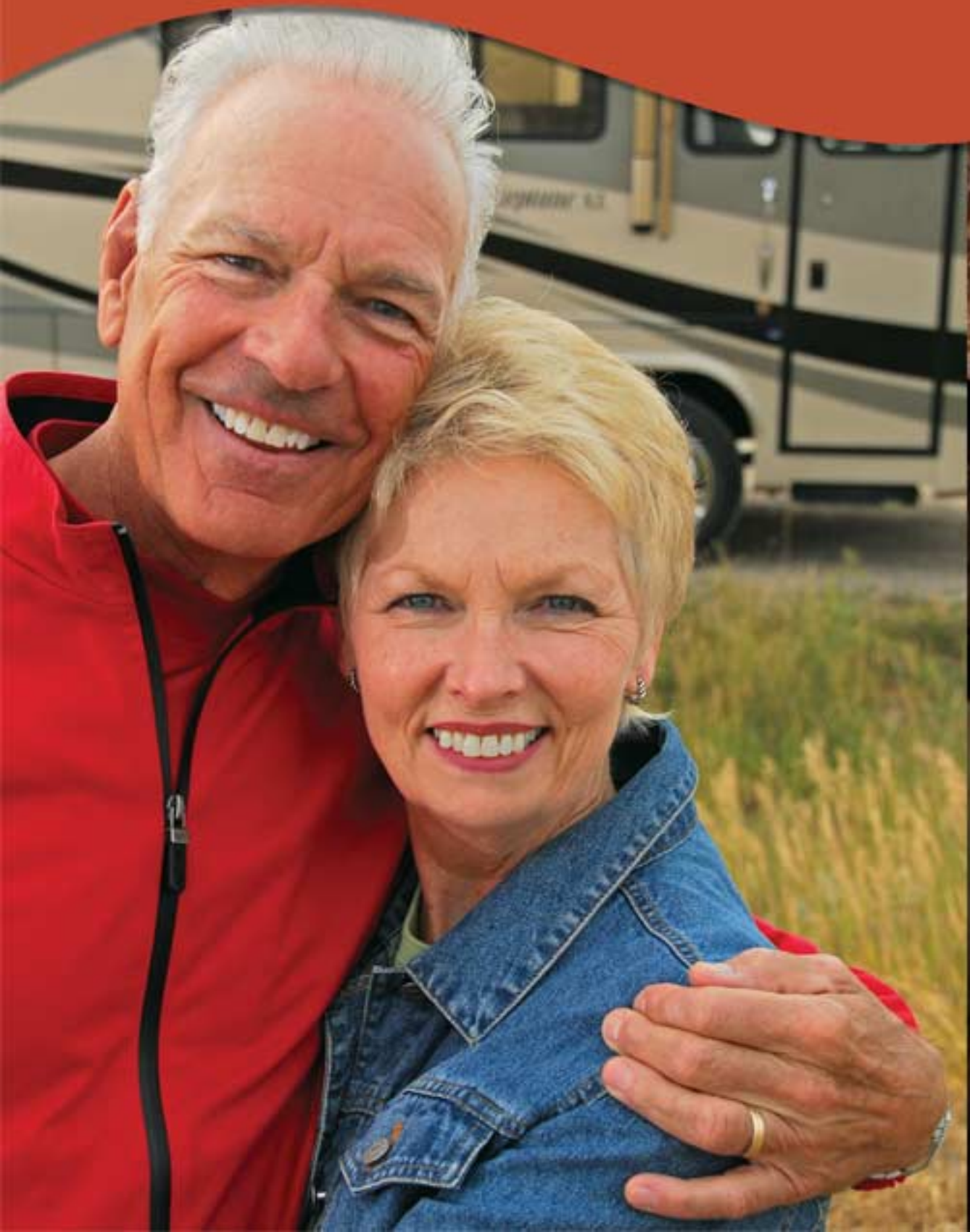

Plus 50 Program

The Plus50 program will teach you the *skills* you need to succeed as a National Park Service volunteer or seasonal employee. During the six sessions, you will:

- Learn how to effectively prepare and present interpretive talks as identified by the National Park Service.
- Gain behind-the-scenes knowledge of park history and operations.
- Experience an up-close look at each park's opportunities and challenges.
- Discover employment and volunteer opportunities within the parks.

You will attend six sessions, two at the WDT campus in Rapid City and one at each of the National Park Service areas participating in the training. WDT will provide transportation to each of the parks and back to Rapid City. You will even *learn* during the trips through presentations from National Park Service administrators and educators.
