Course Description: This course presents an overview of the regulations that are related to environmental protection, including OSHA regulations, Clean Air Act, SARA, RCRA, and similar regulations. This course also provides an awareness of why the regulations exist, how they are enforced, penalties for noncompliance, and practical experience in interpretation of the regulations.

- Explain how environmental regulations are designed to prevent environmental degradation

- Explain why federal laws and regulations are powerful tools that empower individuals to prevent or stop large companies and corporations from harming human health and degrading the environment
