Course Description: In this introductory geomorphology course, students will study how stream processes shape landforms. Emphasis is placed on a basic understanding of geomorphic processes. Relationships between properties of earth materials and the forces applied to them by gravity, wind, ice, water, waves, and humans also will be explored. Lectures will address the conceptual basis of geomorphology, while the laboratory exercises will combine interpretation of aerial photographs and experiments on the water table with other hands-on activities that are both practical and empirical.

- Explain how running water shapes and modifies landforms

- Evaluate the effects of climate, geology, and human activity on river channels
- Demonstrate their ability to collect, compile, analyze data, and summarize results
