Course Description: This course consists of neurology, endocrinology, allergies and anaphylaxis, gastroenterology, urology, environmental, toxicology, infectious and communicable diseases, hematology, gynecology, obstetrics, behavioral/psychiatric emergencies, and advanced medical life support.

Prerequisites: Current CPR Card, Current NREMT Certification, HC 114, and HC 213

Grade Requirement: A minimum grade of C must be earned in this course to be eligible to graduate from the Paramedic program and to progress to courses that require this course as a prerequisite.

- Understand the major systems to include the neurologic, endocrine, and GI systems
- Assess patients experiencing allergic, renal, and toxicology emergencies
- Determine absorption routes that infectious diseases may enter the body and the impact it will have on the body
- Identify patients experiencing a behavioral emergency and how to protect patients and yourself from injury
- Identify OB/GYN emergencies and how to properly perform treatment
