Course Name: Paramedic Clinical I
Credits: 2
Contact Hours: 80 clinical hours throughout course

Course Description: The student's clinical rotations will include intensive care unit, operating room, IV lab, pediatric unit, and labor/delivery/newborn nursery/NICU.

Prerequisites: Current CPR Card, Current NREMT, enrolled in or completed 1st semester of Paramedic program technical (FFP) courses

Grade Requirement: A minimum grade of C must be earned in this course to be eligible to graduate from the Paramedic program and to progress to courses that require this course as a prerequisite.

Progression: Progression to FFP280 live clinical sites requires the student to have successfully passed PALS, ACLS, PHTLS, and demonstrate competency as indicated by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians practical skill sheets in the areas of practice to be performed during the clinical rotation.

- Choose a treatment plan for a patient under preceptor guidance
- Observe preceptor in ICU and NICU
- Participate in patient care in operating room, IV lab, pediatric unit, and labor/delivery/newborn nursery
