Course Name: Paramedic Clinical II
Credits: 4
Contact Hours: 160 clinical hours throughout course

Course Description: The student's clinical rotation will be in the emergency room.

Prerequisites: Current CPR Card, Current NREMT, FFP 110, FFP 115, and FFP 120

Grade Requirement: A minimum grade of C must be earned in this course to be eligible to graduate from the Paramedic program and to progress to courses that require this course as a prerequisite.

Progression: Progression to FFP281 live clinical sites requires the student to have successfully passed PHTLS and AMLS and demonstrate competency as indicated by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians practical skill sheets in the areas of practice to be performed during the clinical rotation.

- Assess patients in the emergency room
- Choose a treatment plan for a patient under preceptor guidance
- Participate in patient care in the emergency room
