Course Name: Milling Theory and Operations I
Credits: 3
Contact Hours: 1 Lecture; 4 Lab

Course Description: The vertical milling machine and its set-up and operation are introduced in this course. Students will learn milling machine safety, tramming of the mill, and the use of edge finders and dial indicators to locate part features and align work. Use of the Cartesian coordinate system, drilling, surfacing, slotting, pocketing and contour milling procedures will be covered.
