Course Description: The Immunohematology course is an extension of theory presented in the Immunology Course and will transition into the major concepts and principles of Blood Banking. This course will explore basic genetics, blood group systems, and antibodies, with emphasis on ABO grouping, Rh typing, antibody screening and identification, Coombs, compatibility testing, transfusion of blood components, component therapy, and donor selection.

Prerequisites: MLT 205

Grade Requirement: A minimum grade of C must be earned in this course to be

eligible to graduate from the Medical Laboratory Technician Program and to progress to the MLT clinical practicum.
