Course Description: This course will provide opportunities to develop competencies necessary to meet the needs of individuals in a safe, legal, and ethical matter using the nursing process. This course includes nursing theory with an emphasis on care of patients with disease/disorders of the following systems: nervous, sensory, respiratory, circulatory, urinary, gastrointestinal, endocrine, musculoskeletal, integumentary, and hematological. The nursing process is integrated into the study of each disease process.

Prerequisites:	Current CNA certification or a C or better in HC 124 and HC 126, completion of all general education courses, NRS100, NRS105, NRS110, and NRS115
Co-requisites:	NRS200
Grade Requirement:	A minimum grade of C must be earned in this course to be eligible to graduate from the Nursing program or progress into courses that require this course as a prerequisite.
