Course Name: Advanced Nursing Clinical I & II

Credits: 4

Contact Hours: 160 clinical hours throughout the course

Course Description: This course is the clinical component of adult health nursing in which the students provide direct care to patients in a variety of acute, inpatient settings. The students utilize various components of the nursing process to design appropriate care for patients. The student is expected to assess, utilize and apply the concepts of critical thinking, communication, and promotion of safety to the care of patients in the acute care setting. This course will focus on basic phlebotomy, IV infusion skills, and advanced practical nursing skills.

Prerequisites: Current CNA certification or a C or better in HC 124 and HC 126, completion of

all general education courses, NRS100, NRS105, NRS110, NRS115, NRS 121,

and NRS130

Pre- or Co-requisites: NRS200, NRS205, and NRS210

Clinical Progression: Students must maintain a "C" or better in NRS200, NRS205, and NRS210 to

participate in NRS221 live clinicals.

Grade Requirement: A minimum grade of C must be earned in this course to be eligible to graduate

from the Nursing program or progress into courses that require this course as a

prerequisite.
