Course Description: Surgical Technology Clinicals take place at a healthcare facility. It consists of work experience in the perioperative environment. Students will participate in a minimum of 120 surgical procedures in the scrub role. The procedures will be completed in a variety of areas and must meet ARC/STSA requirements. Students will perform and develop to entry-level competency as a surgical technologist. At the completion of the course, students will return to main campus to take the Certified Surgical Technologist exam required of accreditation.

Prerequisites: Successful completion of all first through third semester ST technical courses
