



Application Checklist – Practical Nursing Program

The following must be completed to be considered for the Practical Nursing program.

I HAVE SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION TO THE COLLEGE:

- Prior to applying to the Practical Nursing program, students must apply for admission to WDT – Allied Health. The College application can be completed online through the Admissions Office website: [Admissions Application](#)
- Students who are currently enrolled at WDT do not need to complete the College Admissions application.

The following items below must be turned in to the Practical Nursing Department:

I HAVE COMPLETED THE APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO THE PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM.

GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES:

The following courses must be completed or in progress at the time of application to the Practical Nursing program:

- CIS105 Microcomputer Software Applications
- ENGL101 Composition
- HC114 Anatomy and Physiology for the Health Professions
- MATH101 Intermediate Algebra or higher
- PSYC101 General Psychology

CURRENT CNA CERTIFICATION:

- Current CNA License or complete HC124/126 Introduction to Patient Care/Lab with a 'C' or better.

TEST OF ESSENTIAL ACADEMIC SKILLS (TEAS):

- Composite score of a 60 or higher
- You can take the TEAS a maximum of 3 times, with a 1 week waiting period between re-tests. (\$70.00 testing fee each test).

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Hepatitis B Series
- Annual TB Test
- Polio
- Tdap
- Varicella (Chicken Pox)
- Annual Flu Shot

CPR CERTIFICATION:

- Provide a copy of current American Heart Association Healthcare Provider BLS CPR certification.

DRIVER'S LICENSE

- Provide a copy of current driver's license.

Note: If you are or have been convicted, pleaded guilty or no contest to, or received a suspended imposition of sentence for a felony or certain misdemeanors, you are advised that you may not be able to complete all course requirements for your chosen program, you may be prevented from taking required certification/licensure examinations in your chosen program field, and you may be prevented from gaining employment in your program field.

Clinicals, practicums, and internships may include, but are not limited to, differential shifts (evenings, nights, weekends, and holidays) to meet industry expectations. This may require travel outside the Rapid City Area.
