Alumni Feature - Jim Manternach, Computer Networking Class of 2011

Please tell us about yourself. Who are you and what do you do?

My name is Jim. I'm a Systems Engineer for Monument Health, specializing in Epic Client Systems. Epic is the name of the Electronic Health Record (EHR) software that Monument Health uses. In my role, I maintain many different types of servers associated with Epic, as well as storage systems and load-balancing appliances.

What made you choose to attend Western Dakota Tech?

I had done a few years of school at another college but didn't know what I wanted to ultimately do. I was directionless until I started working at a local computer repair shop. At the time I had very little computer knowledge, I was just the guy answering the phone and running the register. At one point all our technicians quit, so I started learning more about computer systems to cover the role and discovered that I enjoyed it! One of my good friends had already made plans to attend WDT, and when I saw the school had a program that aligned with my new-discovered interests, I decided to join him.

What was your experience like at the school?

My time at WDT was one of the best chapters of my life. I had a ton of fun in class and made many friends, some of whom I still work with today. I did participate in SkillsUSA, placing high enough locally that I was sent to represent the school in a larger event in Kansas City. Both the local and Kansas City competitions were a great time and helped me practice skills outside of the classroom.

What was your experience of gaining employment in your field like after graduation?

I was very fortunate that one of the local SkillsUSA judges was the IT Director at Crazy Horse Memorial. After the competition, he offered me a job! I worked at Crazy Horse Memorial part-time until I graduated, and then full-time for over a year after. One of my classmates obtained a job at Monument Health, and when another position in his team opened, he told me to apply. I was hired and have stayed with Monument Health ever since.

How was the bond between you and the faculty at the schools?

I found the staff that helped with enrollment and registration very helpful. I've always been more of a shy and anxious type, so their patience and willingness to help me really made a difference. One of

my teachers remained in touch with me and volunteered to be a proctor for my future online tests, even though they were for classes at another school.

What is something at Western Dakota Tech that you absolutely loved participating in?

My favorite group to be a part of at WDT was my second-year Computer Networking class. Those of us who made it through year one and returned for year two really came together as a tight-knit team. We worked together on school projects and met outside of school to help each other prepare for certification exams. I owe a lot of my success to that group, and the friends I made there was a large factor in my getting the job I still love today.

Has anyone in your life been a mentor to you? How did their advice help you?

I've been fortunate enough to have many great mentors, throughout school, civilian employment, and the military. There is too much to unpack from all the mentoring to summarize in a short answer, but I think the largest takeaway was the practice of leadership. My mentors not only demonstrated strong leadership, but they developed it in me and expected me to practice it as well.

What advice do you have for anyone considering attending Western Dakota Tech?

Do whatever you can to form close bonds with your classmates, especially the ones in your major! It not only makes the schoolwork easier but makes the experience more enjoyable and helps you to network after graduation. Also, look into four-year programs at other schools once you've graduated. After transferring my WDT credits to another school, it didn't take me much longer to also earn a bachelor's degree.
