Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

Students are encouraged to complete the application process at their earliest convenience.

To gain acceptance into the WDT Practical Nursing program, applicants must:

- _____ 1. Complete WDT application online at www.wdt.edu
- _____ 2. Submit high school transcript or GED scores.
- _____ 3. Submit immunization records verifying two doses of MMR vaccinations.
- _____ 4. Submit official college transcripts if you have previously attended a post-secondary institution.
- _____ 5. Complete the ACCUPLACER test (\$15.00 fee).
(The ACCUPLACER test will be waived if you have an ACT sub score of 18 or better in English, Math, and Reading, or a SAT sub score of at least 440 in Verbal and Math. The scores must be within the last five years.)

The ACCUPLACER test is offered Monday – Friday at 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m.

Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS), \$40.00 fee. **(Individual total score – 54 minimum)** You can take the TEAS a maximum of 3 times, with a 1 week waiting period between re-tests (\$40.00 testing fee each time). Study Guides are available in the Admissions Office. A \$40.00 deposit is required.

The TEAS evaluates four areas that are essential for academic success, they include:
